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Increasing use of Artificial Intelligence Based Language Model ChatGPT in Education Possibilities and Challenges

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Abstract

Artificial Intelligence (AI) based technology has developed so rapidly in the last about a decade that it has become a part of our lives in some form or the other in today's time. The National Education Policy 2020 has made several provisions for proper inclusion of A.I. in education. The recognition of A.I. as a subject at the upper primary level, undergraduate and postgraduate levels reflects its growing importance. A chatbot is a type of AI-based language model that is trained to interact with humans. Over the past decades, many types of chatbots have been developed that can respond to human responses for a particular purpose or perspective, but the amount of excitement and surprise that has been seen for ChatGPT is extraordinary. As its advanced versions came out, it is being discussed among the academicians, researchers and people having knowledge of technology, mainly because of its accuracy and reliability. In fact, ChatGPT is the most powerful A.I. based conversational model to date, trained by human reinforcement based on the vast knowledge base that exists on the Internet. It is capable of understanding natural language. When asked about a problem or a question, one can provide answers based on rational and critical thinking like humans. Over the years, ChatGPT has become increasingly used in the education sector. This article presents a nuanced analysis of the new possibilities and challenges arising from the growing use of ChatGPT in education.

These professional workers will definitely help in taking India to a position of excellence in the world in important areas like technical education, genomic studies,

biotechnology, nanotechnology, neuroscience, etc. In such a situation, the need to create an understanding of artificial intelligence among students and its meaningful inclusion in the curriculum from school education to higher education can be understood properly. In such a situation, the importance of artificial intelligence-based chatbots like ChatGPT in the field of education increases significantly, because its rational use can reduce the problems faced at many levels of education. At the same time, its irresponsible use can also give rise to some new challenges. Realizing the importance of AI, the Government of India has taken a number of important steps in the field of education for its promotion and use in proper moral development, some of which are as follows:

Responsible AI for Youth: A.I. and real time applications in education can definitely play a big role in acquiring new skills in students. Department of e-Governance, Ministry of Electronics and Information Technology, Government of India has launched Responsible AI programme at the national level for the youth. The main objective of this program is to

address the lack of technology and A.I. related skills among the students of government schools.

AI Portal-With the joint efforts of the Ministry of Electronics and Information Technology, Government of India and the non-governmental organization NASSCOM, a portal has been developed where individuals with different backgrounds and educational qualifications can connect to this portal. The main objective of this portal is to make information, resources and innovations related to A.I. available on a single platform and reach all individuals.

The International Research Foundation: Research and development plays an important role in the development of any field. Research in different fields can be taken to a different dimension by A.I. Therefore, the National Education Policy 2020 recognizing this potential has proposed a National Research Foundation to strengthen the synergy between R & D, industry and academia so that the gap between these different bodies can be bridged.

Apart from this, in the field of education, important programs like A.I. for All, National Strategy of A.I. for Education, Atal A.I. Lab, Virtual Lab and A.I. Curriculum 2019 under Skill Based Education run by the Central Board of Secondary Education are being run. The objective of these programs is to familiarize the students with A.I. based technologies and skills and prepares them for the needs of the 21st century. It is the endeavour of the Government of India to use A.I. based technologies at the school level to familiarize the students with the correct selection and ethical use of tools like chatbots so that learning related problems can be reduced.

Chatbot: For the first time in the decade of 1964, humans started building machines that could talk to them or respond to them. Named Eliza, this machine was a keyboard-based response machine, in which input had to be given from the keyboard and this machine responded relative to it. In 1995, another chatbot named Alice was developed, which created new possibilities for the then generation with hope and curiosity. After about 10 years of this, advanced chatbots like Amazon Alexa, Google Now, Siri came into existence, which could recognize the voice of humans and give their feedback based on it. So it very accurately presents to you in a few moments an answer based on arguments within 500 words that appears to be written by a human being.

ChatGPT has some qualities within itself, due to which the users who use it are surprised. It has been tuned to the vast encyclopedia of the Internet in such a way that it can display the following features:

Able to Understand Natural Language

- It can communicate.
- He admits his mistakes.
- It is capable of answering follow-up questions.
- It can challenge questions made on wrong grounds.
- It denies unreasonable requests.
- It can provide more detailed information based on conversations than other chatbots.
- It uses about 570 GB of internet data to present solutions to a variety of problems.
- It is a kind of language model, which can generate text and it gives results like human interaction under normal circumstances.

Apart from this, it can also do tasks like classifying text, answering questions, creating text, summarizing text, identifying named units, etc. with utmost ease and accuracy. It can generate these types of chatbots, which can directly talk to the students, which can help them to do better in the field of education. ChatGPT is a type of generative pre-train transformer architecture, which is trained on the basis of extensive data available on the internet. It work son a neural network.

2. What is GPT?

- ChatGpt is an A.I. based conversational model developed by Open A.I. This language is part of the GPT (Generative Pre-Train Transformer) family of models. ChatGPT is designed to engage in interactive and dynamic conversations with users. It provides human-like responses in a very effective manner when users input their queries into it in the form of text. Sometimes it becomes very difficult to distinguish whether the answer received by the user is written by the person himself after his experience and deep reflection or it is generated by the A.I. based language model ChatGPT.
- It is because of the accuracy and authenticity of the answers received by ChatGPT that this A.I. based conversational model remains a subject of curiosity and curiosity for academics all over the world.

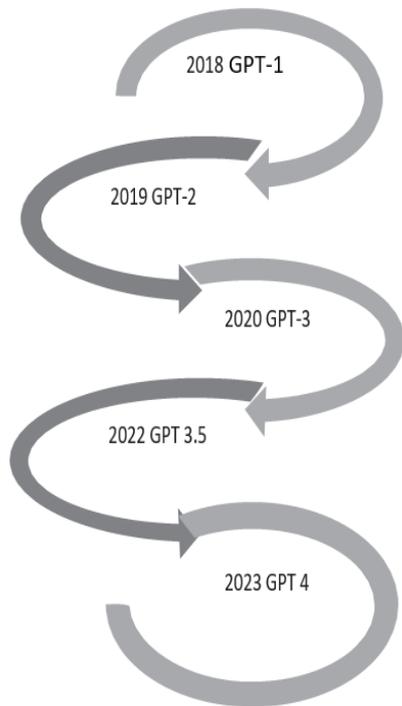


Fig 1: Brief chronology of ChatGPT

The history of ChatGPT is closely tied to the development of the language model of Open A.I. A brief description of the evolution of ChatGPT so far is given in Figure 1.

GPT 1: OpenAI released the first version of Generative Pre-Trend Transformer (GPT-1) in 2018. GPT 1 was a language model, which was trained on a large amount of text data from the Internet. It had demonstrated impressive capabilities in generating text coherently and contextually.

GPT 2: OpenAI released an enhanced version of this model, GPT2, in 2019. GPT2 attracted attention for its ability to generate highly realistic and coherent text, raising concerns about the potential misuse of such technology. To prevent potential misuse as a result, Open A.I. initially allowed limited use of GPT2. Open A.I. 's decision to restrict access to GPT2 prompted widespread discussion on the ethical and security implications of the Shakishali language model. The

goal of Open A.I. was to balance the benefits of A.I. with responsible planning, so it was necessary to keep these things in mind when developing later versions.

GPT 3: In June 2020, Open A.I.N produced GPT 3, the largest and most powerful language model at the time. GPT 3 was trained on a huge corpus of diverse text. This enabled it to generate highly coherent and contextually rich responses. GPT 3 had attracted attention for its impressive linguistic capabilities and potential applications in various fields.

GPT 3.5: Building on the success of GPT 3, OpenAI launched GPT 3.5, an adaptation of the language model designed for conversational interaction. This version of ChatGPT was specifically developed to improve one's communicative abilities by using reinforcement-based learning from human feedback to provide more useful and contextually appropriate feedback.

Open AI API: OpenAI introduced the OpenAI API in 2021, allowing developers and organizations to use ChatGPT's capabilities in their own applications. OpenAI A.P.I. made possible the integration of ChatGPT, expanding the potential applications of ChatGPT to different sectors, cases, levels, devices and services.

GPT 4: This is the most recent version of ChatGPT to date, which was released to users in December 2022 by the OpenA.I. company. This new model had multi-dimensional language dimensions, which could take both text and pictures as input and it is capable of providing written output as feedback. Certainly it was more refined and accurate than the earlier versions.

3. How is ChatGPT Different from other Available Chatbots?

ChatGPT is built on a generative pre-trend transformer architecture, which is trained on large amounts of text data from the Internet. This enables ChatGPT to understand and generate human-like text responses across a wide range of topics. Its training on diverse data sources provides it with a broad knowledge base. ChatGPT is different from other chatbots currently in vogue (Alexa, Siri, Google Assistant, Bixby, etc.).

The potential educational benefits of ChatGPT are notable in that ChatGPT is an A.I. based most powerful language model to date, giving users the same responses as humans. 2. **Quick Access to Knowledge:** Based on its vast encyclopedia, ChatGPT can quickly provide information on a variety of topics, making it a valuable tool for research and learning. This allows students to ask questions and get instant answers, allowing them to explore different concepts in real time and expand their knowledge
 - **Virtual Tutoring:** ChatGPT can act as a virtual tutor, providing clarifications, examples and guidance to students in an interactive manner. It can help in problem-solving, provide step by step instructions, provide feedback on assignments It will also promote independent learning and critical thinking.
 - **Language Learning and Practice:** Language learners can practice language learning by engaging in conversations with ChatGPT. Students can practice speaking, listening, reading, and writing skills by interacting with the A.I. to improve their acquisition of a new language, and receiving suggestions.
 - **Accessibility and Inclusivity:** ChatGPT can address accessibility challenges by providing alternative learning formats. It can convert text into speech and help visually impaired students. One can provide translation services for students speaking other languages and promote inclusiveness in education.

5. Potential Challenges Arising from Increased use of AI-based Language Model ChatGPT in Education

The increasing use of ChatGPT and similar A.I. technologies in education may pose several challenges that need to be carefully considered. A few of the challenges are:

Teachers and institutions should ensure that appropriate safeguards are put in place to protect the privacy and well-being of students.
- Equality and accessibility Unequal access to technology can exacerbate educational inequalities. Efforts should be made to ensure equitable access to A.I. tools and bridge the digital divide.

Meaningful teacher-student relationships and collaborative learning experiences play an important role in education and should not be undermined by technology.
